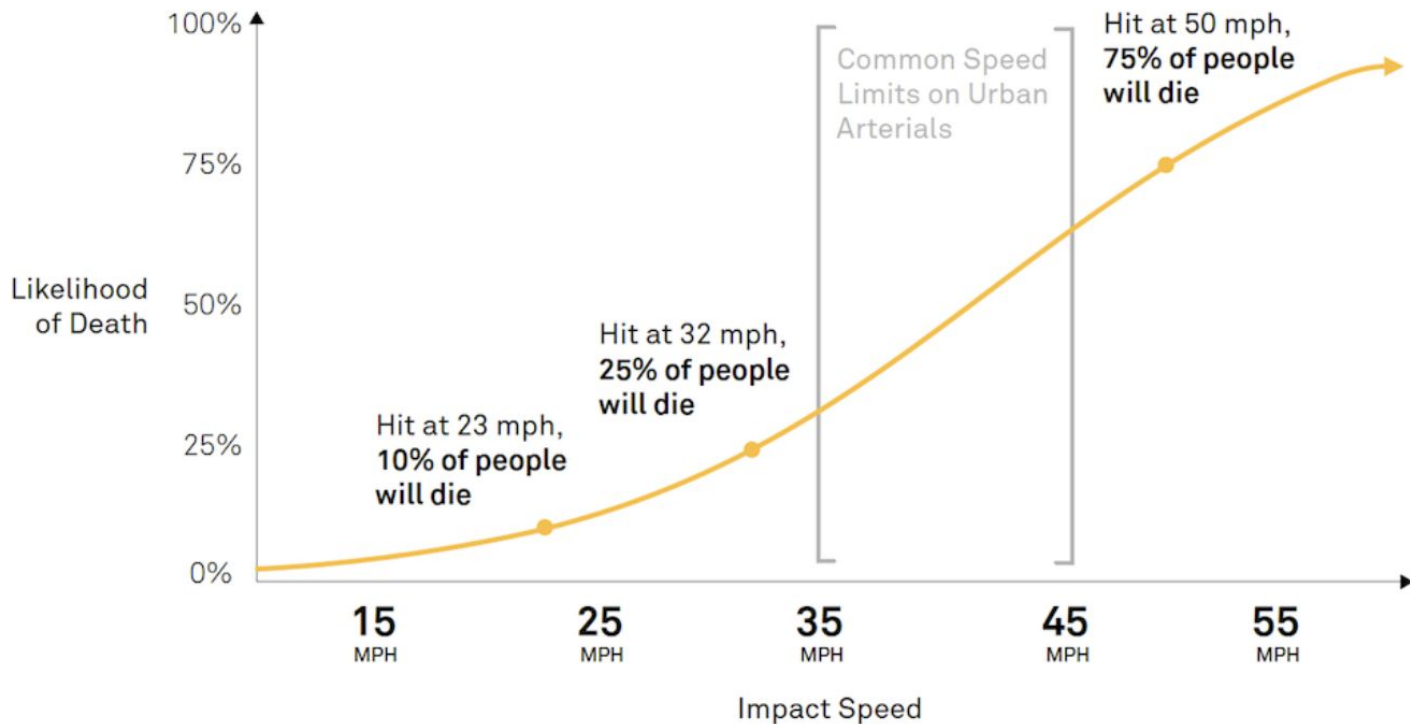
NYC: Traffic crashes [kill more New Yorkers](#) than gun violence.

- [30% of New Yorkers](#) have been injured in traffic violence, and 70% know someone who was injured or killed.
- For every person who dies on NYC streets, 11 are severely injured.

WHAT IS INTELLIGENT SPEED ASSISTANCE (ISA)

- Intelligent Speed Assistance technology, sometimes referred to as “speed limiters”, are devices that limit the speed of the vehicle.
- ISA is dynamically connected to the speed limit of the road using vehicle cameras and road signs, GPS and virtual maps, or both.
- When a vehicle attempts to exceed the speed limit, the ISA interfaces with the throttle to prevent acceleration beyond the posted speed limit, but does not interact with the brakes.
- ISA technology has been added to the NYC Fleet to much success, including a nearly 40% reduction in “hard braking events”.



TYPES OF ISA

FIXED

These devices prevent the vehicle from exceeding a single, programmed top speed (e.g., 80 mph). Trucks have had these for decades.

PASSIVE

Typically integrated into a car by the manufacturer, passive ISA systems warn the driver about the speed limit, but do not prevent speeding. (Required by EU and was proposed in CA but did not pass.)

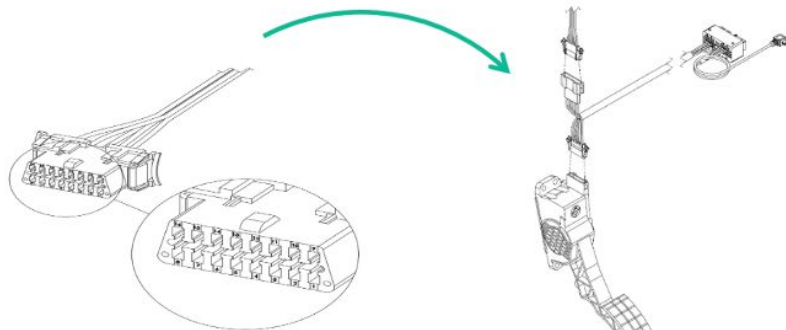
ACTIVE

Can be installed in any vehicle and prevents drivers from exceeding the speed limit (or a set amount above it).

Used for Stop Super Speeders as an aftermarket device.

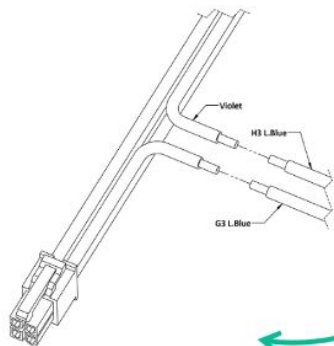

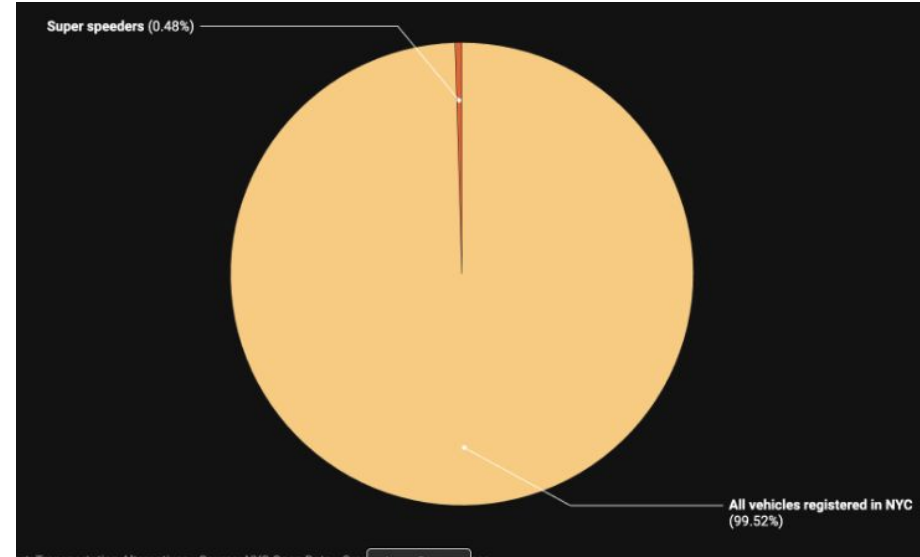

STOP SUPER SPEEDERS: Policy Approach

- Common sense effort – only addresses the most egregious offenders:
 - Less than one percent of NYC drivers
- Modeled after ignition interlock devices (“breathalyzers”) for drunk driving
- Mandates “active” ISA as an aftermarket device
- Studies show super speeders disproportionately cause harm

STOP SUPER SPEEDERS: They Put Everyone At Risk

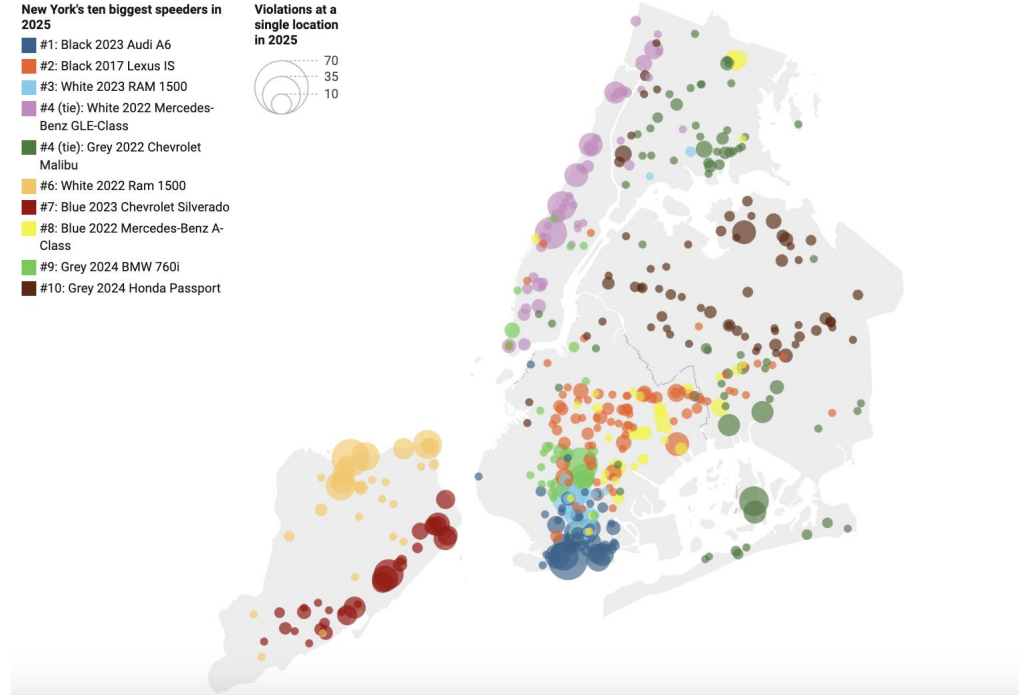
- In 2025, the top 10 super speeders in New York State each received an **average of 179 school zone speed safety camera tickets, with the most reckless driver receiving 259** and the tenth most reckless driver receiving 132.
- More than 2.5 million New Yorkers — including over 500,000 children — live within a five-minute walk of an intersection where one of just these 10 drivers was caught speeding in 2025. That footprint also encompasses 2,376 schools or childcare facilities, 30 hospitals or urgent care centers, and 88 nursing homes.

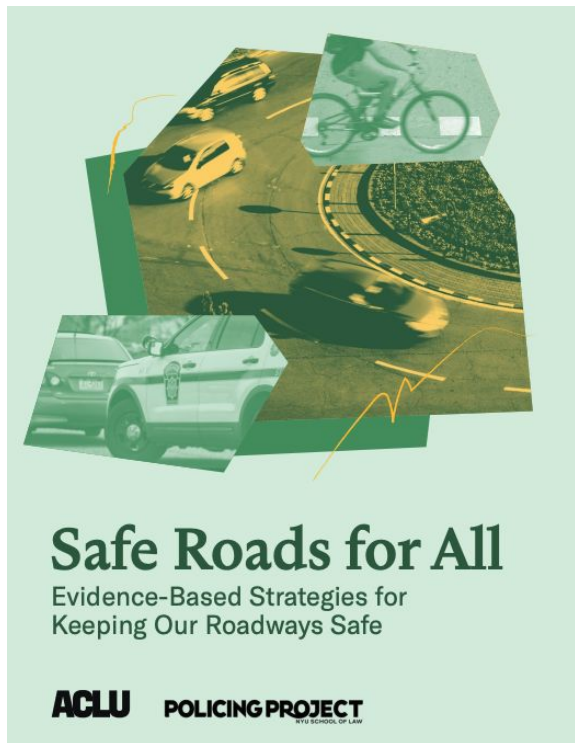

STOP SUPER SPEEDERS: Benefits

- Effective behavior change to address the root cause: excessive speeding
- Does not deny anyone mobility – those with an ISA can continue to go to work, take care of kids, attend medical appointments
- Current approach of fines & license suspension is not working; 75% of drivers with suspended license drive anyway
- It is fair and non-carceral

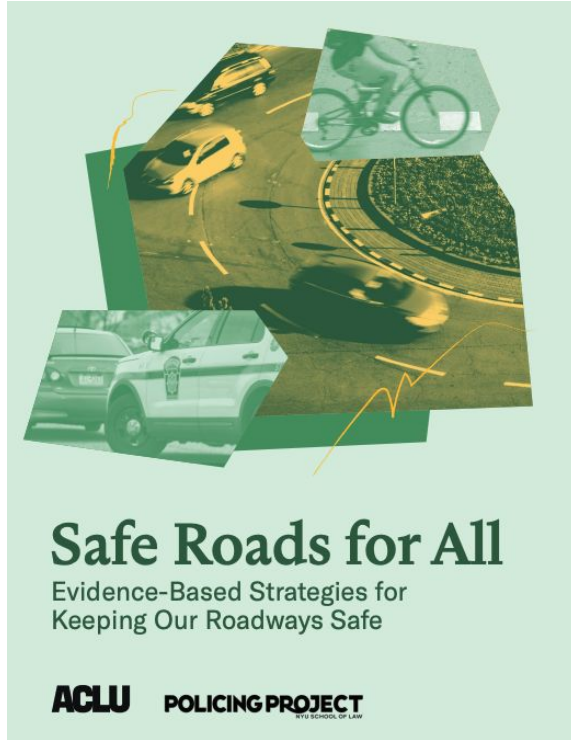
TESTIMONY OF THE POLICING PROJECT AT NYU SCHOOL OF LAW TO THE JOINT LEGISLATIVE BUDGET COMMITTEE - TRANSPORTATION IN SUPPORT OF S.4045

We have done significant work to advance traffic safety, including collaborating with policymakers on legislation to more effectively use law enforcement resources when enforcing traffic violations. One approach we endorse are bill that reprioritize what offenses law enforcement focuses on, emphasizing those offenses most closely associated with crashes—such as speeding—rather than minor equipment issues with little connection to roadway safety. Another facet of improving traffic safety enforcement is smart utilization of innovative technologies that prevent of dangerous driving behaviors, reducing the need for enforcement and the accompanying harms.

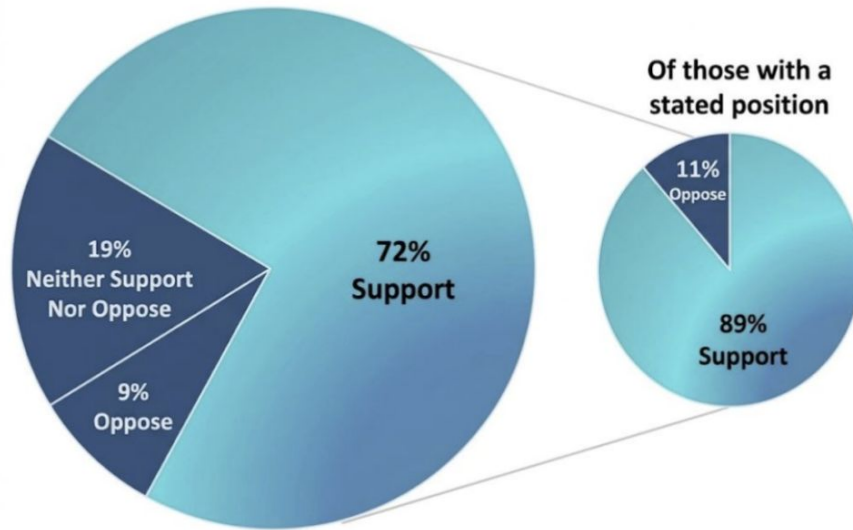

MOST COMMON QUESTION: How much will it cost?

- **Device Costs**

- Similar to the ignition interlock program.
- All costs are incurred by the offender, as outlined in model legislation:
 - Installation: Approximately \$150
 - Monthly Lease: Approximately \$4 per day
 - Removal: Approximately \$100
- Some states have additional one-time fees to pay for administration of the program.

- **Implementation**

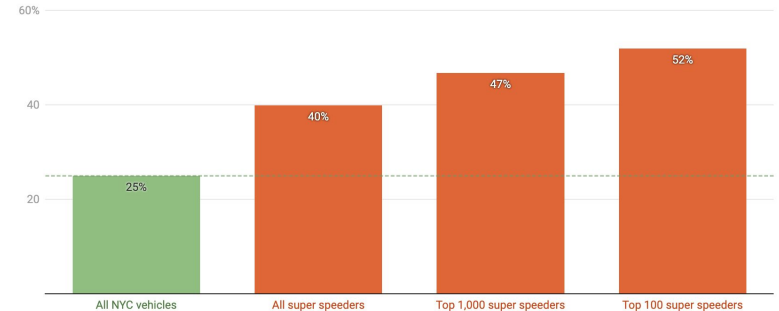
- Most states find that 1 or fewer FTEs are needed to administer the program
- Startup costs can be between \$500K-\$1M, depending on the department, and ongoing costs are approximately \$100K each year.
- Administration of the program is similar to that of the ignition interlock device program.

STOP SUPER SPEEDERS: Mostly Luxury Vehicles, Paying Thousands in Fines

- Super speeders are 72% more likely to drive a new vehicle, and 57% more likely to drive a luxury vehicle than the average driver.
- The more speeding tickets a super speeder gets, the *more likely* they were driving a luxury vehicle:
- The average super speeder is spending \$4,890 in tickets.
 - **The average super speeder would save thousands of dollars under this program.**

Super speeders drive luxury vehicles.

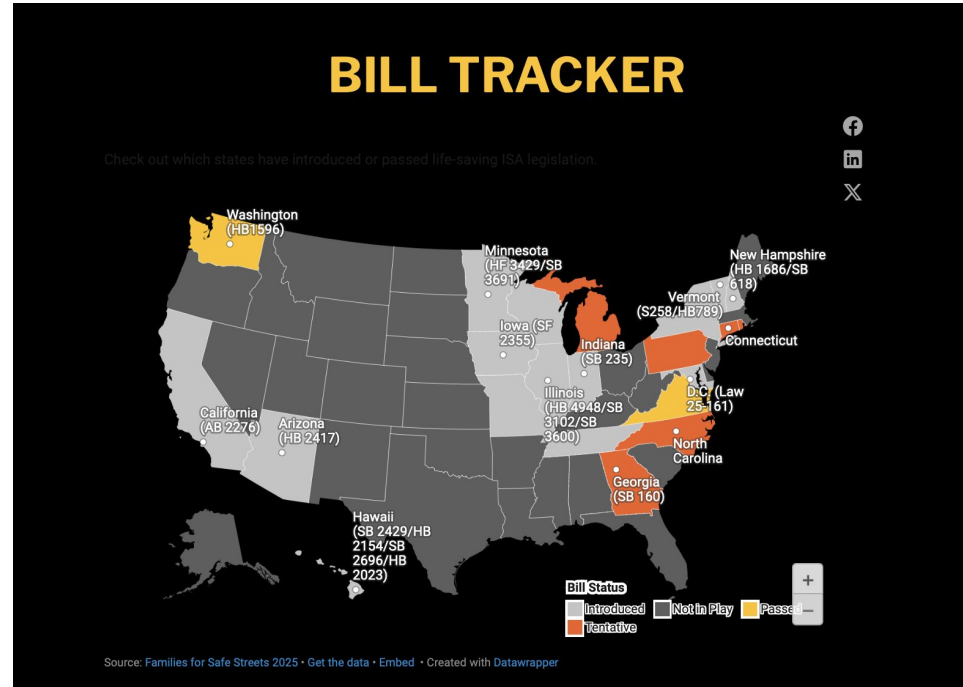
While only a quarter of drivers on the road are operating luxury vehicles, they account for 40% of super speeders. Among the top 1,000 worst super speeders, the most common car brands are BMW and Mercedes Benz.

STOP SUPER SPEEDERS: National Context

- NYS was the first state to introduce a bill in August 2023
- Bi-partisan
- Bills have been enacted in a single session in District of Columbia, Virginia and Washington
- Maryland and Georgia legislatures passed bills in April 2026
- Arizona and Illinois have passed in one house (so far) in 2026
- 12 other bills this legislative session & many are progressing rapidly



STOP SUPER SPEEDERS: New York State

- Included in the Governor's SoS and Executive Budget
 - FY 2027 Executive Budget Part D
- Establishes a NYC pilot program requiring ISA for repeated violations
- Authorizes the NYC to set parameters for the pilot.
- Pilot would take effect one year after enactment and expire on April 1, 2031.

- New York State Senate has included Stop Super Speeders in their budget proposal, as well.
- Being deliberated “at the table” right now





STOP SUPER SPEEDERS: State-of-Play

- Budget was due on April 1, running late
- Session resumes on Monday, April 20
- Some big items remain to be figured out, there may be one or two weeks left on the clock
- We need leadership to know this is a priority, particularly in the Assembly
